	The new building will be 6500 sq ft and staff will be able to stay in old building until new one is
	complete.
	 It will have conventional concrete footing with concrete base.
	• The exterior will be a mix of prefinished wood or composite siding mixed with stone and a
	high-end commercial metal roofing system. (If budget allows it will have hidden seams)
	 It will have a high degree of insulation.
	• Finished Ceiling heights are 9ft with a 2 ft crawlspace for ductwork.
	• The designers are looking to optimize value with price and durability.
	 Construction is aimed to start in March 2025 to May 2026
	Questions from Chief & Council:
	What is the distance from new band office to firehall as there are discussions to put a drive through door for fire hall for safety reasons.
	• There is potential to shift to the east. Shifting too far will create a need for blasting. They would need to know very shortly in order to stay on time.
	What are the dimensions from furthest east to west? (There were no dimensions on any drawings shown at the meeting).
	 They will send a copy with actual dimensions to Josh.
	Questions regarding snow removal in general were asked, especially in regard to other exits. Secretary stated that the current fire exit does not get snow removed very far away from the door at current building.

	 What is the window strength? With all the large windows we may have birds hitting the windows more. They are double glazed but can be upgraded to triple glazed at a higher price if desired. A pattern on the windows can be created in a variety of ways as well if there is a serious concern about birds.
	 What is the pitch of the roof? Very concerned about snow load capabilities and removal. If the roof was covered with asphalt the pitch would be low, but for a tin roof it is right. A structural engineer works on the project and has used snow-load calculation specific to this location. There will be snow guards to keep the snow on the roof. It's a long building, but the span is dramatically short. There will also be snow-stoppers. They are happy to send the calculation of the load it could handle and look into a different roof pitch if requested.
	Location and type of heating/central air was discussed, as well as security.
Outcome:	With so many concerns it is difficult to move forward currently. The plan will be brought to the next community meeting.

	 <u>Health Centre</u> October 1, 2024 is the new date for the Grand opening of Health Centre. In speaking with the CHN a Councillor found out that there is a back up of methane in the P-traps that need to be looked at. Chief is working at getting a commercial inspector to come in.
