ELEMENTS OF LAND PLANNING...

Helps us **UNDERSTAND** current land use activities.

Envisions how land should be used in the FUTURE (20 year horizon is typical).

Proposes actions to make the **VISIONA REALITY**.

Provides a **FRAMEWORK** to guide Chief & Council decisions on land management.

Tells a **STORY** about your community's current and future reserve lands.

COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY PLAN

A CCP is:

- "Comprehensive" because it includes planning for all aspects of the community.
- "Community" because it is a process that is driven and owned by everyone in the community.

KEY BENEFITS

Uses community values to decide what new development can occur and where they are located

Protects environmentally and culturally important lands and water

Strengthens funding applications (Capital Planning, Infrastructure, Community development, etc.)

Can set a foundation for land management tools and self government processes (Development Law, Environmental Assessment Law, Land Code)



SOME OBJECTIVES OF LAND PLANNING


Guide decisions about what gets built and where

Create a shared vision for the future

Protect culturally & environmentally significant lands and water

- 2. Prepare work plan, budget
- 3. Funding application(s)
- 4. Hire planning coordinator / establish planning committee
- 5. Share LUP purpose, engagement activities and schedule information with the community – invite feedback!
